

REFLECTIONS

"Calling them like ${\cal D}$ see them"

This week marks 17 years of marriage for Gigi and I. We have plans to do something later because (*gestures at the month of May*) ... yeah. So for our actual anniversary night, we took the kids to Dean's, picked up a few things for our chickens at Tractor Supply, got some cash out for the kids' field trips, made a run to TJ MAX, and went home. That was it. Again, we have plans to do something special later. But that was our anniversary. Kind of an ordinary night. You might remark that we should have done more. And I understand the sentiment. We will eventually.

To be honest with you, I find it kind of fitting that our anniversary was spent doing very mundane, ordinary things. Because that's most of our marriage. Sure, we have spent nights staring at the stars, but most of them include washing dishes. We have gone to romantic restaurants just the two of us, but most meals are cooked and eaten at our kitchen table with the kids. We have taken times to get away just the two of us, but we tend to spend the most time together at home in pajamas. That's most of our relationship and there's nothing wrong with that.

It's easy to fall into the trap of imagining that our relationships should always be full of passionate nights and days spent walking beaches together. That's what happens in the stories, right? Movies of couples falling in love and not spending a moment apart from one another. But that literally can't be all the time. It just can't. We have to go to work. We have to do laundry. We have to take out the garbage, go grocery shopping, eat oatmeal.

I'm not saying we shouldn't have times like the ones we imagine in books or movies. We should! That's a healthy part of a marriage relationship. But we can't begrudge the rest of our relationship (the majority of our relationship) for not being the most dramatic parts. I'm grateful for 17 years of marriage and not just the highlights. I'm grateful for the ordinary, for the routine. Because I get to spend those days with Gigi. That's special enough.

All right, time to land the plane here. It's easy to fall into the trap of imagining that our relationship with God should always be full of intense moments of clarity and passionate ministry. But the ordinary routine of daily prayer and choices of conscience is special enough. Because we get to spend it with the God who loves us.

"O what a wonder it is! A glory amazing, yet true;

Today's hymn is relatively new, as far as hymnody goes. It was copyrighted in the mid 1980's. Nevertheless, since publication, it has become a favorite in worship for many Baptist congregations. We will sing it this coming Sunday, but it is not in our hymnal, which is unfortunate, especially since its copyright is held by Broadman Press, a Baptist entity.

Rae Whitney was an extremely gifted hymnwriter whom I've had the pleasure of meeting and with whom I have attended classes at gatherings of the Hymn Society. Sadly, she died in 2023 in her home state of Nebraska. She was a delightful person to know and in her presence, one had the sense of being among brilliance when it comes to shaping language.

In this hymn, she takes biblical pillars which hold up the faith and allows the singer to touch them and stand under their faithful support. "For God so loved the world, His only son he gave, that whoever believes in Him should have eternal life." And, "We learn to follow Him by living in God's Word."

I resonate warmly with the opening lines of the final stanza: "It is a wondrous thing God's glory to proclaim." There is something divinely blessed about our appointment as ambassadors for Christ. That God employs us, mere mortals, in spreading the good news of His salvation is a wonder, a glory.

And the refrain employs the singer primarily in that very task: proclamation of God's love: "O what a wonder it is, a glory amazing, yet true; O what a wonder, O what a glory that God loves me and you."

For God so loved the world He gave His only Son, That all who would believe in Him, He'd save them every one.

We learn to follow Him By living in God's Word. The Holy Spirit gives us grace To know and love our Lord. Tho into sin and shame
Our thoughts and actions stray,
Still Jesus calls us to Himself,
