REFLECTIONS

"Calling them like ${\cal D}$ see them"

Another birthday is coming for me, which at this point in my life isn't all that big of a deal anymore. When you've had 40 or so of them, the novelty may not have worn off, but it certainly has seen some wear and tear. I enjoy what the day brings and certainly the love shared by family and friends, but I don't spend a lot of time ruminating on my age and what that ought to mean or whatever.

No, more often I find that I'm noticing and thinking about the passage of time on my children's birthdays. *They're HOW old? We're THAT close to driving? How much longer will I have them?* It's in these moments that my own age settles in. If my *children* are that age, what does that make me?

I got a call from my dad today; nothing too remarkable about that. We catch up not too infrequently. We shot the breeze, talked about his high school class reunion (I won't tell you the number, but it was *a lot*), and my upcoming birthday. He sighed, said the age I'm turning this year, and then he said, "That makes me feel *so old*." I guess it's not just me realizing my age through my children.

First Christian Church is going to be celebrating 75 years as a church together next month! I'm delighted for them and I hope their celebration will be as sweet and joyous as ours was a few years ago. 75 years in this community is a wonderful testament to life and God's ministry.

Of course, God's ministry reaches back farther than 75 years. God's ministry dates back even farther than the Church. God's ministry was alive and active for hundreds of years before the Temple in Jerusalem was constructed and it predates the formation of the nation of Israel. God's been working and ministering since the beginning if we take the stories seriously (and I hope we do).

We may feel old. I know my body likes to tell me that with more and more frequency. (Yes! I know that I need to wait until I reach 55 or 65 or 105 or whatever. Give me a break! I still wake up hurting some days because apparently I can sleep incorrectly now. (When did that happen?) But let's have a little perspective, you and I. We're still young and fresh in the context of the world and God's ministry in it. We still have work to do, gifts to give, and joy to spread.

Today's hymn devotion is one I've written about before. Trouble is, I don't think I can improve on those thoughts, so I submit to you a rerun from 2020.
