REFLECTIONS

"Calling them like D see them"

This week's article will be the second episode in the not-so-regular series on what it means to be Baptist. The last time I wrote on this, I pointed you to Walter Shurden's excellent little book called *The Baptist Identity*. He writes about the 4 characteristics that have *historically* made Baptists distinct. I emphasize that because it's not always the case, and maybe less so today than ever. Also, last time I mentioned it, I explained the first of the 4 "Fragile Freedoms" that Shurden offers: Bible Freedom. If you need a refresher, I'm posting these on the church blog.

Today's Fragile Freedom is Soul Freedom. This has gone by several names that you may recognize if you hung around Baptist churches of yesteryear – "soul competency" or "priesthood of all believers." It's a full thought, so it'll take me a bit to fully explain it. Maybe as much as *two paragraphs*. Buckle up.

Soul Freedom means that you don't need another human to gain access to the Divine. Historically, we call those people "priests." They stand in the gap and appeal to God on behalf of people. People don't relate directly to God, they must have a priest intercede with God for them. Soul Freedom means you don't need that. To paraphrase the Book of Hebrews, Jesus Christ is our priest and he's so good at the job, we don't need another. You can see how that idea would set us apart from say, the Roman Catholic Church whose priests very much function as intermediaries. They hear confession & administer the graces of God in sacraments. Baptists believe that you just do that on your own.

The logical consequence is that no one can do faith for you. The priest can't forgive you. Your parents can't believe for you. The church can't do good in the world and credit it to your account. If you need no intermediary, then you have no cover. It's just you and God. This is why Baptists don't baptize infants or young children. They believe that it must be a person's own faith, their own volition. No one can choose that for you.

That's also the responsibility of Soul Freedom. You are indeed free to relate to God but that means there's a responsibility to do that. No one can do your faith for you. Not your pastor, not your Sunday school class, not anyone. Their faith doesn't count for more or less than yours. And it can't take the place of yours.

For the purposes of this discussion, God's love and God's mercy are one and the same. We'll talk mostly about his mercy, but it all applies equally to his love.

Can you visualize the metaphor here? "Like the wideness of the sea"? In the mid eighties, I took a couple of trips to the Bahamas on a small diving boat. I remember vividly the vastness of the sea, being unable to see anything on the horizon but more and more ocean. It helps me internalize this picture of God's mercy.

In our efforts to understand God's love, we have a tendency to set limits on it, to contain it to aid in our comprehension of it. In this hymn, Fredrick Faber admonishes us not to magnify God's strictness "with a zeal he will not own." Depending on how you grew up, strictness may be a realm of comfort for you, but don't project it onto God's mercy.

Think of that ocean, stretching beyond all that you can see with your eyes. God's mercy is like that. Lean into the mystery. Lay hold of the vast-beyond-comprehension aspect.

Turns out, the best way to understand the expanse of God's mercy is to expand our own. What can you tolerate? What can you forgive? Forgive some more. Consider that person and/or their behavior that you find intolerable and unlovable. Reconsider and accept. Simplify your own love. Embrace. You'll get a glimpse.

Keep trying, but know this: you'll never fully get there. Keep trying, nevertheless.

There's a wideness in God's mercy, like the wideness of the sea. There's a kindness in His justice, which is more than liberty.

There is welcome for the sinner, and more graces for the good. There is mercy with the Savior, there is healing in his blood.

But we make His love too narrow by false limits of our own, and we magnify its strictness with a zeal He will not own.

For the love of God is broader than the measures of the mind, and the heart of the Eternal is most wonderfully kind.

If our love were but more simple, we could take Him at His word, and our lives would be more loving in the likeness of our Lord.
